



ARROW INTERNATIONAL

TRADES SCHOLARSHIP

2012

Aim: To support students enrolling on Trades based programmes e.g. Automotive Engineering, Carpentry, Hairdressing, Beauty, Aviation Engineering and Conservation at NMIT.

Area of Use: Students wishing to study at NMIT after successful completion of the NMIT Certificate in Trades and Primary Industries enrolling in 2012 on a course leading to a recognised qualification.

Eligibility: Applicants under 20 years of age and/or Year 12/13 school leavers having achieved minimum NECA Level 2. Students must be enrolled on a fulltime, full year programme and have met specific programme entry requirements.

Exclusions: This Scholarship may not be used in conjunction with the Half Degree for Free Scholarship. These Scholarships are not available for NMIT short courses and Employment Scholarship Programmes (unless stipulated). Only one NMIT Scholarship can be awarded to a student in any one Calendar Year.

Funding: These Scholarships are funded by Arrow International Limited to support and develop learners at NMIT and assist their progress towards the world of work.

Value: Maximum allocation of up to 5 scholarships of \$1,000.

Allocation: The scholarships as designed to assist students with the tutorial fee component of fees for the enrolled course.

Promotion: Information and application forms will be circulated via programme tutors, via posters and on the NMIT website.

Criteria:

- School Leavers must have completed at least year at Secondary School and have achieved minimum of NCEA Level 2. Or
- Be under the age of 20 having completed
- Have exhibited high motivation and the ability to succeed
- Demonstrate the need for financial assistance that may prevent their ability to succeed
- Successful recipient must be available to attend Scholarship ceremony.



Panel Selection: The selection panel will consist of Head of Construction, Automotive, Mechanical and Engineering and the Youth and Community Manager or nominated representatives.

Selection will be made at a time that allows the grant/scholarship to be awarded at the NMIT scholarship function held early in the academic year.

Timing

Applications must be received on an official application form to NMIT by 2pm on 22 February 2012. Late applications will not be accepted.

Validation

The award of a Scholarship shall become void within 2 weeks after receiving official advice unless the recipient completes and forwards the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to NMIT Scholarship Coordinator that states:

- The Recipients acceptance of the Scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference. Associated with this Scholarship
- Agreement to participate in specified promotion as per Terms of Reference
- The Recipients intention of pursuing the course of intended study set out in his/her application.

Payment: Payment will be made by direct credit onto the recipients tuition component of their student fees or to Studylink if a debt exists.

Withdrawal: Students must repay the full scholarship to NMIT should they withdraw from the course or fail to meet pass rates to continue or minimum attendance requirements or for any other reason that they are unable to continue with full-time study.

Privacy: The award of the scholarship will be acknowledged in the local newspapers, website, posters and advertising.

In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, recipients will need to sign a Release Form giving their permission for NMIT and Arrow International Limited to use recipient's personal information for publicity. The recipient can control the content used and length of time it is used.
