

NMIT/KITE George Martin Scholarship (In memory of Uncle George Martin) Terms of Reference 2012

Area of Use	The scholarship is designed to assist full time or part-time NMIT programmes students identifying as Māori with fees, who showing potential to excel in the chosen field/s of study.
Value	Up to \$1000 (tuition fee only) will be awarded.
Eligibility	Applicants must be students identifying as of Māori descent, on select programme/s of study that will enhance Māori ki Te Tau Ihu o Te Waka ā Māui.
Criteria	<p>The scholarship is designed to assist students with tuition fees in whichever field the successful applicant is studying in.</p> <p>Applicants must be:</p> <p>A descendant of 1 or more of the 8 Iwi within Te Tau Ihu o te Waka a Māui,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ngāti Koata• Ngāti Tama• Ngāti Toa• Ngāti Rārua• Te Āti Awa• Rangitāne ki Wairau• Ngāti Apa ki te Rā Tō• Ngāti Kuia <p>Studying in Marlborough</p> <p>They must have also met the entry criteria and be accepted onto a programme of study at NMIT</p>
Exclusions:	This Scholarship may not be used in conjunction with the Half Degree for Free Scholarship. This Scholarship is not available for NMIT short courses or Employment Scholarship Programmes (unless stipulated). Only one NMIT Scholarship can be awarded to a student in any one Calendar Year.
Funding	Funded by Koru Institute of Training Education (50%) and Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology (50%)
Promotion	NMIT will circulate application forms and information will be via the NMIT Information and Enrolment Centres, and included in NMITs scholarship marketing material including the website.

KITE will promote Scholarship on the KITE website.

Selection

A selection panel of up to maximum of 4 people.

To include:

- A descendant of George Martin or a Whanau representative
- CEO KITE Institute or a representative
- NMIT Director of Māori Education or Representative

Timing

Applications must be received on an official application form by Nelson Marlborough Institute of Technology by 2pm, 22 February 2012. Late applications will not be accepted. Selection and confirmation will be made during March each year.

Administration

Administration is the responsibility of the NMIT

Panel Decision:

Decisions of the Panel are not open to appeal or question. The Panel need not give reasons for any of their decisions.

Validation:

The award of a Scholarship shall become void within 2 weeks after receiving official advice unless the recipient completes and forwards the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to NMIT Scholarship Coordinator that states:

- The Recipients acceptance of the Scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference. Associated with this Scholarship
- Agreement to participate in specified promotion as per Terms of Reference
- The Recipients intention of pursuing the course of intended study set out in his/her application.

Payment:

Payment will be made as a rebate of fees.
