

NMIT PROGRESSION SCHOLARSHIP

TERMS OF REFERENCE

2012

- Name: NMIT PROGRESSION SCHOLARSHIP
- Value: A maximum allocation of 2 x \$2,500 may be awarded.
- Funding: Nelson Polytechnic Education Society.
- Duration: Applications for students enrolling in year two of study for the first time in 2012.
- Payment: By direct credit onto tuition fee component of study for 2012.
- Area of Use: Students progressing to Year 2 of a Diploma.
- Promotion: Application forms and information will be circulated via student enrolments, and advertised via posters and on the NMIT website.
- Criteria: Students who have successfully completed Year 1 of a Diploma programme (the Certificate) and who intend to progress to Year 2 of the programme with the intention of completing the Diploma, i.e. Applied Fitness, Aquaculture, Adventure Tourism and Tourism Management. Must be studying fulltime and be a New Zealand resident or hold a residency permit.
- Exclusions: This Scholarship may not be used in conjunction with the Half Degree for Free Scholarship. Only one NMIT Scholarship can be awarded to a student in any one calendar year.
- Panel: The Panel will be made up of one Group Manager or representative and two NMIT staff members. Selection will be made at a time that allows the scholarship to be awarded early in the 2012 academic year.
- Decision: Decisions of the Panel are not open to appeal or question. The Panel need not give reasons for any of their decisions.
- Timing: Applications must be received on an official application form to NMIT by 2pm on 22 February 2012. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.

- Validation: The award of a Scholarship shall become void within 2 weeks after receiving official advice unless the recipient completes and forwards the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to the NMIT Scholarship Coordinator that states:
- The Recipient's acceptance of the Scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this Scholarship
 - Agreement to participate in specified promotions as per Terms of Reference
 - The Recipient's intention of pursuing the course of intended study set out in his/her application.
- Studylink: Permanent residents and Australian citizens will now be subject to a two year stand down before they can access student loans via Studylink. For more information please contact www.studylink.govt.nz .
- Privacy: In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, recipients will need to sign a Release Form giving their permission for NMIT to use recipient's personal information for publicity. The recipient can control the content used and length of time it is used.
