Applications due date: 5 pm, 31 March 2023

Selection Criteria:

- Applicants must be fully enrolled in the NMIT Certificate in Culinary Arts Level 4.
- Applicants will need to demonstrate the potential to succeed in their studies by providing the following:
 - Two references
 - A short statement (not more than 300 words) stating their future career plans within the Hospitality Industry, where your passion came from and what Chefs you admire.
- Applicants must be a New Zealand citizens or residents.

The recipients to commit to:

- A report to NMIT on their learning and experiences by the end of their scholarship year.
- Attending the NMIT-sponsored Scholarship ceremony.

What do you receive? Up to a maximum of \$1,000 towards course costs and or equipment

Terms and Conditions:

1. If the applicant changes to part-time, withdraws, or does not complete course requirements to continue onto the following year of study the scholarship may need to be repaid, and this will be at the discretion of NMIT. You must advise scholarships@nmit.ac.nz of your change of circumstances.
2. The Scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the caliber of the applicants does not meet the required standards.
3. This Scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT fee-based scholarship.
4. The scholarship award decision will be made by a panel that includes representatives from the Programme Area and NMIT. Decisions of the Panel are final and are not open to appeal.
5. An application must be completed online via the NMIT website application form and received by NMIT by **5 pm, 31 March 2023**. Late applications will not be accepted. The scholarship will be announced early in the academic year.
6. The student must have commenced study with NMIT and payment of the course made within the NMIT Guidelines, not relying solely on the outcome of the Scholarship.
7. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks after receiving official advice, unless you complete and forward the acceptance and agreement contract to scholarships@nmit.ac.nz that clarifies your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligation, as stated in the terms of reference associated with this scholarship.
8. The award of the scholarship may be acknowledged in media and marketing material by NMIT.
9. The scholarship does not cover student association fees and re-sit costs. If a debt exists to Studylink or NMIT it will be paid to these accounts. If no debt exists it will be paid into your nominated bank account.
10. In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, you will need to sign a release form giving your permission for NMIT to use your personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. You can control the content and the length of time it is used.
