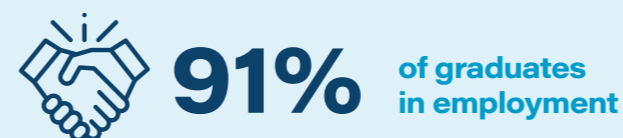
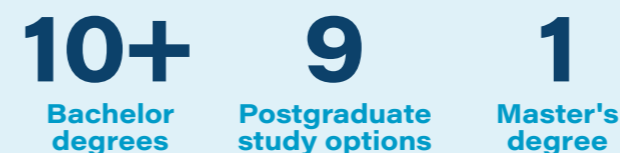

Nelson Tasman

Campus life

Marlborough

- General - enquiries, enrolment, withdrawal, and anything else - we will try our best to find the answers for you.

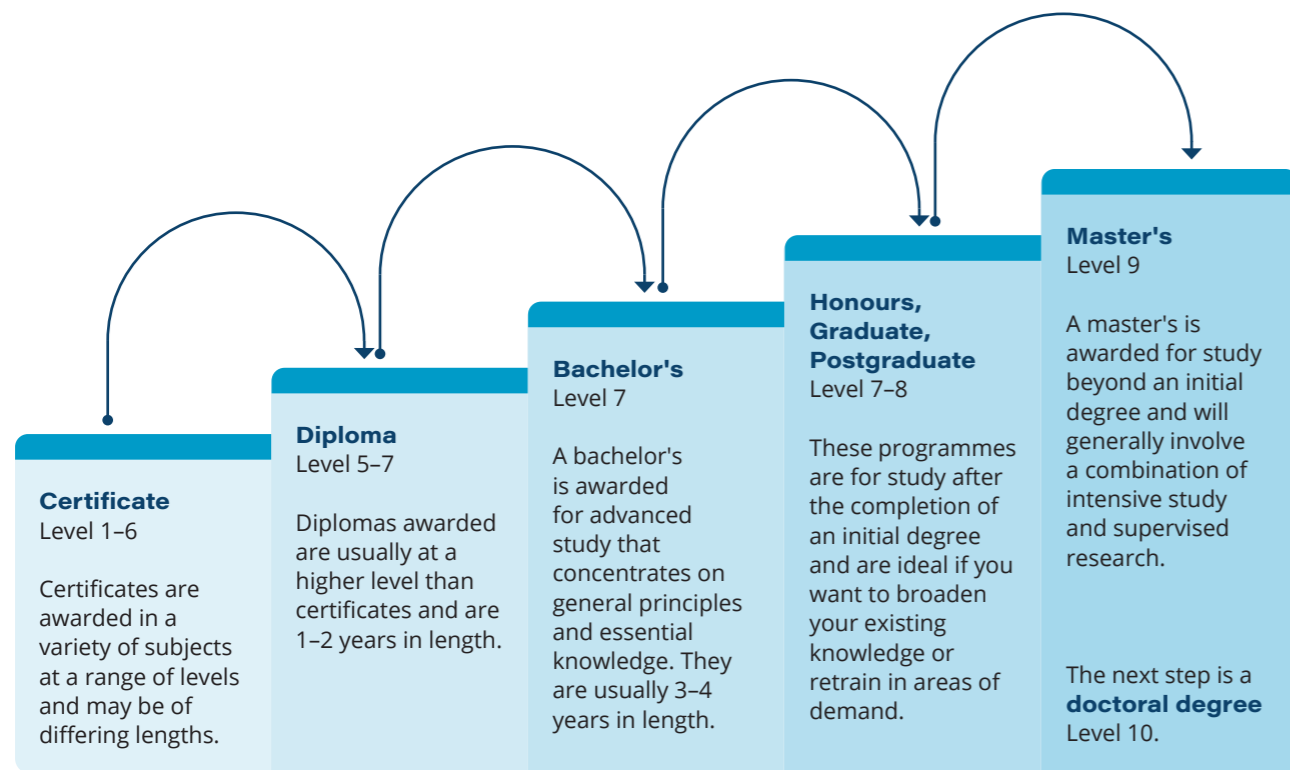

The New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF) is comprised of ten levels and covers a range of qualifications from certificates to doctoral degrees. The levels are based on how complex the learning is; with one being the most basic, through to ten being the most complex.

Whakaakoranga Paetahi Bachelor Programmes

Is a degree from NMIT the same as a university?

Yes, absolutely.

Every bachelor's degree in New Zealand must meet certain academic criteria and be approved by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA), whether they are delivered through an institute of technology or a university.

And even better... all NMIT bachelor's degrees are designed to prepare our graduates to be highly work ready.



Tāura Postgraduate

Postgraduate study is designed to build upon your existing degree qualification.

If you do not have a degree, in some cases extensive work experience may be considered through an application for Recognition of Academic Credit (RAC).

Work and world ready

The advantage of gaining your postgraduate qualification through NMIT is the applied nature of our programmes. What you learn is directly applicable to the workplace.

What is University Entry for 2024/2025?

University Entrance (UE) is the minimum requirement to study most New Zealand degrees.

If you don't have UE, you can show you have equivalent skills for tertiary study gained through study, work or life experience. You may also need to meet English Language requirements.

NCEA Level 3

Three subjects — at Level 3, made up of 14 credits each, in three NZQA approved subjects.

Literacy — 10 credits at Level 2 or above, made up of 5 credits in reading and 5 credits in writing.

Numeracy — 10 credits at Level 1 or above, made up of achievement standards (specified achievement standards available through a range of subjects), or unit standards (package of three numeracy unit standards 26623, 26626, 26627 - all three required).

Achieved a qualification at a similar level to Cambridge or Bursary? We may be able to consider it as part of your application to study with us.

Scholarships

Youth Guarantee

Youth Guarantee is open to 16-24 year olds. You can study for free on selected programmes that are part of the Youth Guarantee initiative and receive a travel subsidy.

Allowances

If you are attending a full-time programme of 12 weeks or more and are aged 18 years or over, you can test your eligibility for a student allowance. Some 16 and 17 year olds may also qualify.

If you are under 24 years old you are subject to a parental income test which may affect your student allowance rate or eligibility.

Loans

Student loans are administered by StudyLink and Inland Revenue. Subject to your eligibility the amount you can borrow includes course fees, course-related costs, living costs and a loan administration fee.

This programme will prepare you for success in your chosen field. It offers a specific pathway to a degree in Nursing, Art and Design, Counselling, or Social Work.

Ideal if you want to develop the skills to start or boost your career, this programme will give you the necessary confidence to build your study skills, gain introductory knowledge, and meet the entry requirements you need to succeed.

Entry requirements

A minimum of 40 credits NCEA Level 2 across four subjects including;

- Literacy – 10 credits at Level 2 or above
- Numeracy – 10 credits at Level 1 or above, or
- New Zealand Certificate in Study and Career Preparation (Level 3)

Alternative Entry

Applicants who are unable to provide evidence that they meet Academic Entry Requirements, but who can demonstrate acquired skills for tertiary study gained through study, work and/or life experience, may be approved for alternative entry. This may include Recognition of Prior Learning. Contact NMIT for advice.

Gutsy move to study pays dividends

An unfulfilling insurance job and the desire to create a new future on his own terms saw Gillan Harris make the move to Nelson and embark on a degree in business at NMIT.

Having grown up in Canterbury, Gillan was in his early 20's, employed in a commissioned-based insurance job and struggling to find a happy work-life balance.

The decision to leave his job and move to an unfamiliar city to study for a Bachelor of Commerce, Management and Marketing was a gutsy move for Gillan. Just a year later, his decision began paying dividends.

Gillan has been lucky enough to be nominated by NMIT for a business programme aimed at helping improve the Māori economy and its business capabilities. The programme, normally reserved for third-year students, was offered to Gillan based on his academic achievements.

"This is an opportunity for me to really demonstrate what I've learned so far," says Gillan, **"We connect with Māori businesses and gather insight into how we can improve them in an international context; basically, bringing Māori business into the world."**

Gillan says returning to study did pose a few initial challenges but as soon as he accessed NMIT's student support services, he was set up for learning success.

"I utilised some of the student support available, including the academic writing and referencing system workshops, because I had been out of school for quite a while," says Gillan.

Gillan says studying for a degree at a smaller learning institution like NMIT has some real advantages.

"I love NMIT, it's so easy to connect with the tutors and touch base to make sure I'm on the right track," says Gillan, **"If I was at a university doing this degree, I'd just be a number."**

Gillan says if you're stuck in a job you don't like and thinking about returning to study, just go for it.

- Special Entry approval is required from the Curriculum Manager or delegate.
