

See the world with a career in the Maritime industry



There are a huge range of career options in the maritime industry. From hands on roles on the deck or in the engine room to being up in the bridge in full uniform navigating and skippering the vessel.

Starting out as a Deckhand you can expect to earn \$35-45K per year. An experienced deck-hand can earn up to \$90K per year. Marine Engineers starting out usually earn \$60-80K per year, and up to \$180K with 5 years' experience. A Skipper of the deep-sea fishing vessel usually earns between \$130-250K per year.

To start out in the maritime industry you'll need at least some basic training in sea survival, first aid and safety. Then experience on board a vessel to get 'sea time'. You then progress in your career by gaining qualifications backed up by sea time. At NMIT we have a wide range of maritime qualifications, both entry level and advanced. 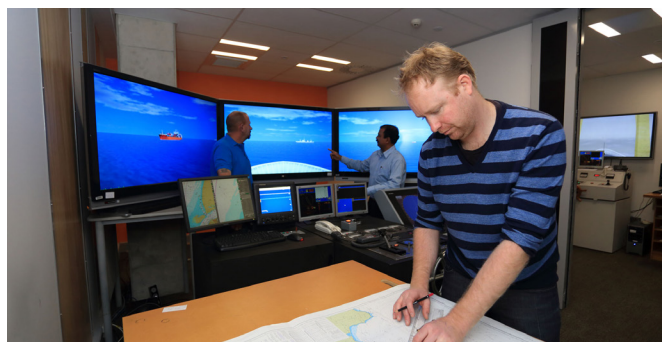

Hit the ground running in this hands on course, making the most of the maritime and hospitality facilities at NMIT. During the programme you will have five days of powerboat training and will spend five days aboard a yacht navigating the Abel Tasman.

Through this programme you will gain the skills you need for your Standards of Training Certification and Watch keeping (STCW) and Security Awareness Certificates through Maritime New Zealand.

New Zealand Certificate Domestic Maritime Crewing

Qualified Deck Crew

Level	3	16 weeks	Zero fees	Start February 2017

During the first 3 weeks of this 16 week programme you will get hands on training in fire-fighting, first aid, maritime survival, navigation and more on the NMIT campus.

Then, over a minimum of 12 weeks you will complete your training record book in a maritime work placement*, gaining experience using the skills you learnt in your first weeks at NMIT.

Finally, you return to NMIT to complete your final assessments and receive your qualification.

The NMIT qualification along with your completed training record book will form key parts of your application to Maritime New Zealand for your Qualified Deck Crew licence.

With this licence you can start work in the maritime industry and gain valuable sea-time that can pathway you into further maritime qualifications to be a skipper, mate, engineer and more.

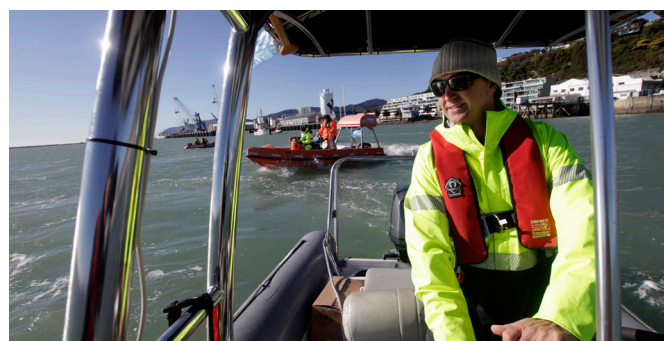

Ever wondered what qualification you need to be a skipper on a water taxi that takes passengers in and out of the Able Tasman? Or aboard a chartered fishing boat?

A Skipper Restricted Limits licence will allow you to work as the Skipper of a small vessel, carrying up to 19 passengers.

NMIT's Maritime Operations Skipper Restricted Limits course is an approved training course which forms part of your applications for your Skipper Restricted Licence. You will also be required to do 200 hours of sea time and complete a training record book.

This is a great qualification if you have friends or family with a boat. You can complete most of the components of the Training record book on a pleasure craft, and NMIT have the facilities for you to practice and demonstrate these skills for your assessments.
