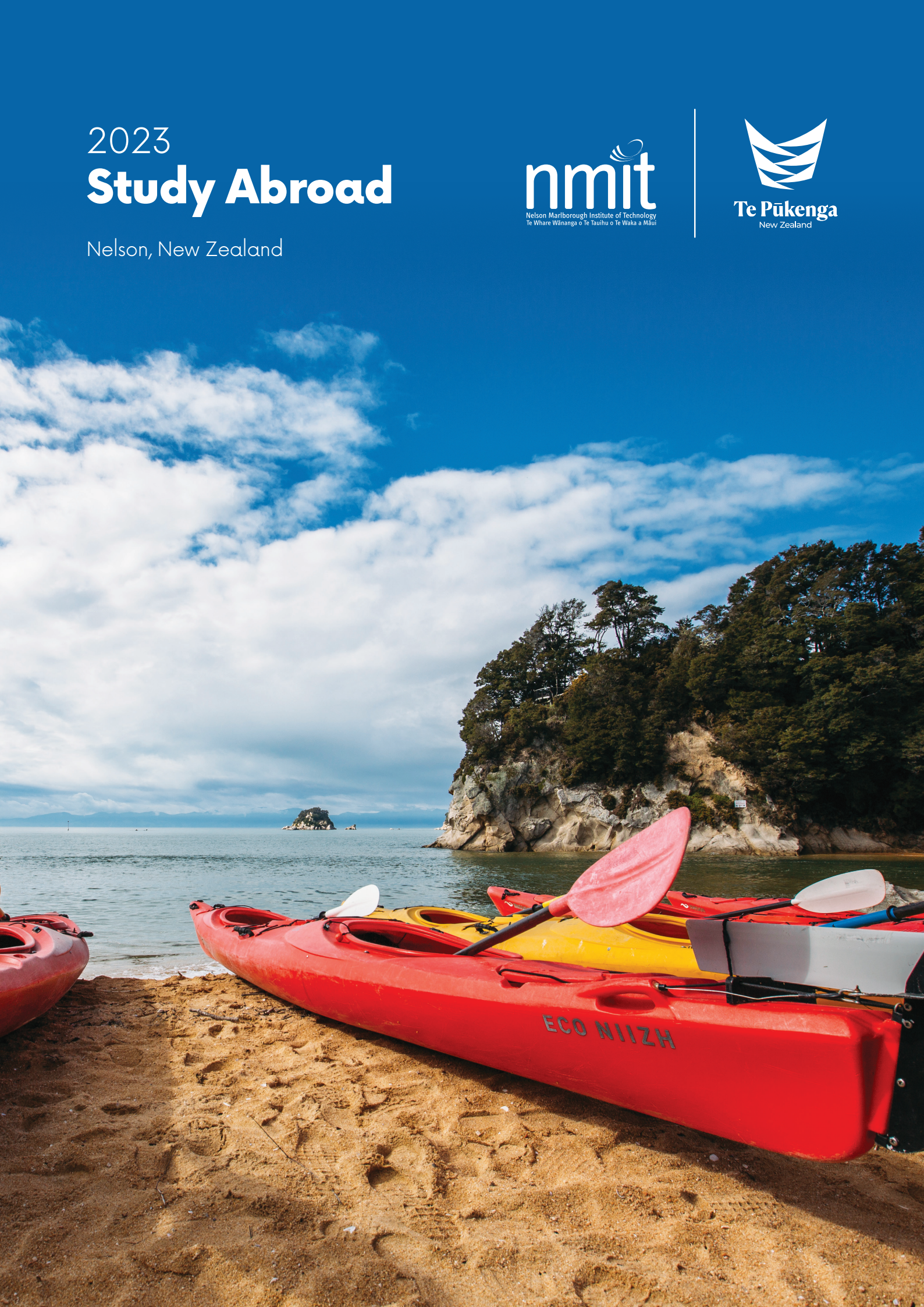

# Study Abroad subjects

NMIT offers bachelor's degree level studies to Study Abroad students in the following majors. Most courses are worth 15 credits, and you must study at least three courses. Four courses is an average workload that is 60 NMIT credits (30 ECTS / 15 US Semester Credits).

These courses will give you the opportunity to learn about managing people, effective industry specific marketing and event management within a New Zealand context.



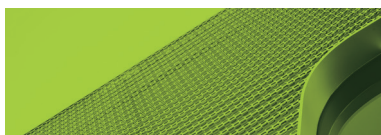
## Business

## Civil Engineering

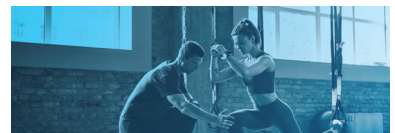
Learn about civil engineering in New Zealand by taking electives that specialise in roading, highways, traffic, structures, water, waste and surveying.

# Stand-alone programmes



## Viticulture and Winemaking (Marlborough Campus)

1.5 hours' drive from Nelson is NMIT's small niche campus for wine. This is a standalone Study Abroad experience where you live in the city of Blenheim and only take courses in viticulture and winemaking. The Marlborough region produces 78% of New Zealand's grapes for wine and is the home of the acclaimed New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc variety. If studying in our February – June semester you may include a course that allows placement in a winery to produce your own vintage!



## Adventure Tourism

Spend a single semester or full year in the outdoors with NMIT's adventure tourism programme. In this programme no two weeks are the same, your classroom is the diverse wilderness area of the top of the South Island. During the programme you will get the chance to experience:

## Key dates 2023

### Semester 1

- > **Semester one start** 20 February
- > Semester one mid term break 7 - 21 April
- > **Semester one exams end** 30 June

### Semester 2

- > **Semester two start** 17 July
- > Semester two mid term break 25 September - 6 October
- > **Semester two exams end** 24 November

Make sure your flights arrive before the start of the semester and your return flights are after the semester ends.

## Entry requirements

For students coming to NMIT from our partner institutes: In general, if you have your home institute's approval to study at NMIT we will likely approve you to study with us. For all other students we expect you to have above average grades at your home institute. In addition, English requirements must be met, this is generally an academic IELTS of 6.0 (no band below 5.5) or a TOEFL Internet-based test (iBT) of 60 (with a writing score of 18), or approved equivalent – see our website for more details.
