NMIT Scholarship 2025 Annie Currie Legacy Scholarship Applicant Terms of Reference

Value:

Up to \$8,000.00 (including GST if payable) towards course fees for a **female** ākonga in full time study with NMIT enrolled in their second or third year on the Bachelor of Nursing Level 7.

Application due date:

Sunday 15 March midnight.

Selection criteria:

- Applicants must be a female New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- Applicants must be enrolled in full time study on their second or third year on the Bachelor of Nursing Level 7 programme.
- Applicants must be a fees paying ākonga (i.e. not receiving Fees Free during intended year of Scholarship acceptance).
- These scholarships are not available for NMIT short courses.
- Applicants must not have received any other scholarship at NMIT previously.

Applicants must demonstrate the potential to succeed in their studies with NMIT by providing the following:

- Two character references.
- Academic transcripts from previous years of study.
- A statement of approximately 300 words describing their chosen study, future career plans, and explain their goals for the future.

What do you receive:

The scholarship is a one-off payment up to the \$8,000.00 towards course fees.

What do you need to commit to:

- Applicants may need to attend a scholarship panel interview if required.
- Applicant is encouraged to attend the scholarship awards ceremony in Nelson.
- Agree to be available for promotional purposes by Annie Currie Legacy Fund or NMIT as per your Media Consent Form.
- Acknowledge your award by thanking Annie Currie Legacy Fund on your LinkedIn and/or other appropriate social media channels.

Terms and conditions:

1. The scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarship has passed.
2. Applications must be completed online via NMIT's website and received by the application due date. **Late applications will not be accepted.**
3. This scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT scholarship.
4. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, resit costs or repeat course costs.
5. The recipient must have commenced study with NMIT and payment of the programme of study has been made within the NMIT Guidelines, not relying solely on the outcome of the scholarship being awarded.
6. If the recipient withdraws, or does not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be repaid. This will be at the discretion of Annie Currie Legacy Fund and NMIT.
7. The recipient must advise scholarships@nmit.ac.nz of any change to their circumstances relating to their study with NMIT.
8. The scholarship award decision will be made by Annie Currie Legacy Fund.
9. Upon being awarded the scholarship the recipient must complete and forward the **Acceptance Agreement** and the **Media Consent Form** to scholarships@nmit.ac.nz. This initiates their acceptance of the scholarship and indicates their agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.
10. In accordance with the Privacy Act 2020, the recipient will need to sign a Media Consent Form giving permission for NMIT and Annie Currie Legacy Fund to use their personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. The recipient can control the content and the length of time it is used.
11. Annie Currie Legacy Fund and NMIT will promote the Annie Currie Legacy Scholarship recipients in appropriate media in Te Taihū and throughout New Zealand and within NMIT marketing material which includes brochures, website, and display materials.
12. The award of a scholarship shall become void after two weeks if the **Acceptance Agreement** and the **Media Consent Form** are not completed and forwarded to scholarships@nmit.ac.nz
13. The scholarship winner will be announced in the academic year and awarded at the scholarship ceremony which you are expected to attend.
14. The agreed scholarship amount will be paid to StudyLink or to NMIT towards course fees. If the recipient has paid their fees themselves, the scholarship amount will be deposited into a nominated bank account.

StudyLink notes:
