



CCL Information Technology Scholarship Terms of Reference

Value: \$ 2,500 towards course fees for the Bachelor of Information Technology

Aim of the Scholarship:

To support students who show ambition to achieve a Bachelor of Information Technology through NMIT.

Application due date: 5.00pm – 12th of February 2021

Selection criteria:

- You must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Enrolled to commence study, full-time, on the Bachelor of Information Technology at NMIT in 2021.
- Demonstrate a passion for Computing and Information Technology and ambition to obtain the Bachelor of Information Technology qualification though answering the following questions:
 - Tell us what excites you about Computing and Information Technology? E.g. Your hobbies, interest or knowledge of the IT industry (Approx. 200 words)
 - What are your aspirations, what do you want to do, when you have completed the Bachelor of Information Technology? (Approx. 200 words)

What do you receive?


- The scholarship is a one-off payment towards course fees to the maximum value of \$2,500. If the student is eligible for the 'first year fees free' government subsidy, the scholarship will be applied in credit to their NMIT account for their subsequent years course fees.

What do you need to commit to?

- You must attend the Scholarship Presentation Ceremony in 2021 at the Nelson Campus
- Agreeing for your name and photograph to be used, in relation to this scholarship, for the purpose of promoting the Bachelor in Information Technology programme at NMIT. See Section 11 under Terms and conditions.

Terms & Conditions

1. The scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarships has passed.
2. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, re-sit costs or repeat course costs, text books and any other course materials.
3. If the condition of the Scholarship covers course materials and tools then this will be agreed with the Scholarship Coordinator to meet the Programme requirements.
4. If you change to part-time study, withdraw, or do not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be repaid. This will be at the discretion of NMIT. You must advise scholarships@nmit.ac.nz of your change of circumstances.
5. This scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT scholarship.
6. The student must have commenced study with NMIT and payment of the Programme of study has been made within the NMIT Guidelines, not relying solely on the outcome of the Scholarship being awarded.
7. The decision about awarding the scholarships will be made by a panel which includes representatives from NMIT. Decisions of the Panel are final and are not open to appeal.
8. Applications must be completed online via the NMIT website and received by NMIT by 5.00 pm on 12th February 2021. Late applications will not be accepted. The scholarships will be announced early in the academic year and awarded at the Scholarship Ceremony which you must attend.

9. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks after receiving official advice unless you complete and forward the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to NMIT that clarifies your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.
 10. If a debt exists to Studylink or NMIT it will be paid to these accounts. If no debt exists (e.g. if the student is eligible for first year fees free) the scholarship will be credited to your NMIT account for use on the 2nd year of the Bachelor of Information Technology. In this case, if the student does not enrol on the second year of study, they will forfeit the scholarship. This scholarship cannot be used towards any other programme of study at NMIT.
 11. In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, you will need to sign a Media Release Form giving your permission for to use your personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. You can control the content and the length of time it is used.
