



Construction/Joinery Scholarship

Mitre 10 Mega Nelson will assist two students enrolled in the NZ Certificate in Construction Trade Skills in 2023.

Students from Carpentry or Joinery can apply to win one of two \$1000 gift vouchers to purchase tools for their programme.

Value: \$1000 x 2 Scholarships for tools of the trade

Aim of the Scholarship:

The Mitre 10 Mega Nelson scholarship is designed to support students who are undertaking the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills – Carpentry strand which is a one-year full-time programme of study at NMIT in Nelson.

Application due date: 5.00 pm – 31 March 2023

Selection criteria:

- You must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Applicants must demonstrate a passion for carpentry as a chosen field of study and show a commitment to developing their skills within the construction industry and should demonstrate the potential to succeed in their studies by providing the following:
 - Two Character/work references
 - A statement of approx. 200 words explaining how the scholarship will assist them in their studies and future career plans within the Construction Industry.
- Previous evidence of carpentry work/projects if possible
- The applicant may also need to attend a Scholarship panel interview if required.

What do you receive?

- Each scholarship winner will receive one \$1,000 Mitre 10 Mega (Nelson) voucher to assist them with tools of the trade required for the programme.

What do you need to commit to?

- Must attend the Scholarship Presentation Ceremony in 2023 at the Nelson Campus
- Agree to be available for promotional purposes by Mitre 10 Mega Nelson/NMIT

Terms of Reference

Terms & Conditions

1. The scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarships has passed.
2. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, re-sit costs or repeat course costs.
3. If you change to part-time study, withdraw, or do not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be repaid. This will be at the discretion of Mitre 10 Mega Nelson and NMIT. You must advise scholarships@nmit.ac.nz of your change of circumstances.
4. This scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT scholarship.
5. The student must have commenced study with NMIT and payment of the Programme of study must have been made within the NMIT Guidelines, not relying solely on the outcome of the Scholarship being awarded.
6. The scholarship award decision will be made by a panel which includes representatives from Mitre 10 Mega Nelson, the Programme Area and NMIT. Decisions of the Panel are final and are not open to appeal.
7. Applications must be completed online via the NMIT website and received by **5.00 pm on 31st of March 2023**. The scholarships will be announced early in the academic year and awarded at the Scholarship Ceremony, which you must attend.
8. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks of receiving official advice unless you complete and forward the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to scholarships@nmit.ac.nz. This clarifies your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.
9. Mitre 10 Mega Nelson Scholarship may assist with the purchase of tools and equipment required for the programme from Mitre 10 Mega Nelson.
10. MITRE 10 MEGA NELSON and NMIT will promote the MITRE 10 MEGA NELSON Scholarship recipients in appropriate media in Top of the South and throughout New Zealand with the MITRE 10 MEGA NELSON as appropriate, and within NMIT marketing material which includes brochures, website and display materials.
11. In accordance with the Privacy Act 2020 you will need to sign a Release Form giving permission for NMIT and Mitre 10 Mega Nelson to use your personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. You can control the content and the length of time it is used.
