

Name of Scholarship: Mitre 10 Mega Nelson

Value: \$1000.00 x 2 Scholarships

Aim of the Scholarship

- The Mitre 10 MEGA Nelson scholarship is designed to support students who are undertaking the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills – Carpentry strand which is a 1year full time programme of study at NMIT in Nelson.

Application due date: 5.00pm, 31 March.

Selection criteria:

- Candidates applying for the Mitre 10 MEGA Nelson scholarship will have to demonstrate a passion for carpentry as a chosen field of study and show a commitment to developing their skills within the construction industry.

What do you receive?

- Mitre 10 MEGA Nelson are offering 2 students a \$1000.00 scholarship designed to assist the learner with their studies at NMIT.

What do you need to commit to?

- Attending the scholarship presentation ceremony
- Agreeing to be available for promotional purposes by NMIT
- Completing the full course of study

Terms & conditions

1. The scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarships has passed.
2. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, re-sit costs, or text books and any other course materials. However if the recipient is eligible for the Government's first year fees free policy, the scholarship is to cover associated course costs.
3. If you change to part-time study, withdraw, or do not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be refunded.
4. This scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT scholarship.
5. The decision about awarding the scholarships will be made by a panel which includes a relevant course representative from NMIT. Decisions of the Panel are final and are not open to appeal.
6. Applications must be forwarded on an official online application form and received by NMIT by 5.00 pm on 31 March. Late applications will not be accepted. The scholarships will be announced early in the academic year and awarded at a function shortly thereafter. You must attend the ceremony or the scholarship may be withdrawn.
7. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks after receiving official advice unless you complete and forward the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to

NMIT Scholarship Coordinator that clarifies your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.

8. If a debt exists to Studylink or NMIT it will be paid to these accounts. If no debt exists it will be paid into your nominated bank account.
9. The award of the scholarship may be acknowledged in media and marketing material by NMIT
10. In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, you will need to sign a Release Form giving your permission for NMIT to use your personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. You can control the content and the length of time it is used.
