



NELSON PINE SCHOLARSHIP

Carpentry Scholarship

Terms of Reference 2018 onwards

Area of Use:	New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills
Value:	\$1000 paid as a tuition fees rebate directly onto course fees or studylink if a debt exists. If the student is eligible for the Government's first year fees free policy, the payment will go towards course related costs as administered by the programme area.
Eligibility:	Study must be fulltime. The student must be a New Zealand citizen or hold a NZ residency permit.
Criteria:	Student must show a passion for the building and construction industry and have the ability to excel in study.
Exclusions:	Only one NMIT Scholarship can be awarded to a student in any one Calendar Year.
Funding:	Funded by Nelson Pine Industries Limited and awarded by their representative at the scholarship ceremony early in the academic year. Attendance at the ceremony is required to receive the scholarship.
Promotion:	Application forms and information will be available on NMIT website at www.nmit.ac.nz
Selection:	A panel made up of NMIT staff will consider each application and assist in making the selection.
Panel Decision:	Decisions of the Panel are not open to appeal or question. The Panel need not give reasons for any of their decisions.
Timing:	Applications must be received on the official online application form from nmit.ac.nz by 5 pm on 20 February 2020 . Late applications will not be accepted.

Validation:

The award of a Scholarship shall become void within 2 weeks after receiving official advice unless the recipient completes and forwards the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to NMIT Scholarship Co-ordinator that states:

- The Recipients acceptance of the Scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this Scholarship.
- Agreement to participate in specified promotion as per Terms of Reference.
- The Recipients intention of pursuing the course of intended study set out in his/her application.
- Recipient must be present at the Scholarship presentation event or the Scholarship will be withdrawn.
- If the Recipient is eligible for first year fees free, course related costs must be approved by the programme coordinator as legitimate expenditure prior to the release of funding. Receipt of purchase must be provided.

Privacy:

In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, recipients will need to sign a Release Form giving their permission for NMIT and Nelson Pine Industries to use recipient's personal information for publicity. The recipient can control the content used and length of time it is used.
