

Ngāti Rārua

Terms of Reference

Value: A one off payment to the value of \$1,000. towards course fees.

Aim of the Scholarship: To support learners of Ngāti Rārua whakapapa studying at NMIT who show the potential to make a significant contribution to their whānau, hapū and Iwi.

Application due date: 5pm – 31 March 2023

Selection criteria:

- You must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- Enrolled on a full-time or part- time programme at NMIT.
- The applicant must whakapapa to Ngāti Rārua.
- A statement of approximately 300 words stating what you have chosen to study at NMIT and how this scholarship could help your future career plans and goals as a potential ambassador for NMIT and Ngāti Rārua.
- The applicant may also need to attend a scholarship panel interview if required.

What do you receive?

- The scholarship is a one-off payment towards course fees to the maximum value of \$1,000.

What do you need to commit to?

- Must attend the Scholarship Presentation Ceremony in 2023 at either the Whakatū or Wairau Campus.
- Agreeing to be available for promotional purposes by NMIT and Ngāti Rārua on reasonable notice.

Terms & Conditions

1. The scholarship may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarships has passed.
2. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, resit costs, or text books and any other course materials unless as stipulated above.
3. If you withdraw, or do not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be repaid. This will be at the discretion of the Ngāti Rārua and NMIT. You must advise scholarships@nmit.ac.nz of your change of circumstances.
4. The student must have commenced study with NMIT and payment of the programme of study has been made within the NMIT Guidelines, not relying solely on the outcome of the Scholarship being awarded.
5. The scholarship award decision will be made by a panel which may include representatives from the Ngāti Rārua and NMIT. Decisions of the panel are final and are not open to appeal.
6. Applications must be completed online via the NMIT website and received by **5pm on 31 March 2023**. The scholarships will be announced early in the academic year and awarded at the Scholarship Ceremony which you must attend.
7. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks of receiving official advice unless you complete and forward the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to scholarships@nmit.ac.nz. This confirms your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.
8. The agreed scholarship amount will be paid to the Studylink account for the enrolled programme in 2023 or to NMIT. If there are remaining funds following payment of the programme fees, this amount will be deposited into the recipients nominated bank account. If the recipient has paid their fees themselves, then on proof of payment money will be returned to the recipient. If the NMIT programme does not have a second year of study, the funds will be deposited into the recipients nominated bank account with the intention that it is used towards course related study costs.
9. In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, you will need to sign a Release Form giving your permission for NMIT and Ngāti Rārua to use your personal information for reasonable publicity purposes in relation to the scholarship. We will consult with you on how this will look and how it will be used.
