

Wine Marlborough Scholarships

Value: One scholarship of \$1,500

Aim of the Scholarship

To support students in the second year of the Bachelor of Viticulture in Wine Making at NMIT.

Application due date: 31 March

Selection criteria

- Enrolled on Year Two of the Bachelor of Viticulture and Wine Making.
- You'll need to demonstrate the desire to succeed in your studies. Please describe your future career plans within the wine industry and a statement describing the role of Wine Marlborough (<http://www.wine-marlborough.co.nz/>).

What do you receive?

- The scholarship is a one off payment towards course fees to the maximum value of \$1,500.00.
- Regular meetings with Wine Marlborough General Manager

What do you need to commit to?

- Attending the scholarship presentation ceremony.
- Meeting once each term (four times a year) with the General Manager of Wine Marlborough Ltd. The purpose of the meetings will be:
 - for you to provide a progress report on your learning experiences
 - for Wine Marlborough Limited to offer an industry perspective to the challenges that you may be facing in your learning, assisting you to build confidence, provide a fresh perspective, inspiration or simply be a sounding board to bounce ideas off for study and career aspirations.
- Agreeing to be available for promotional purposes by NMIT and Wine Marlborough

Terms & conditions

1. These scholarships may not be awarded in any given year if the calibre of the applicants does not meet the required standards, even if this decision is made after the application date for the scholarships has passed.
2. The scholarship does not cover student association fees, re-sit costs, or text books and any other course materials.
3. If you change to part-time study, withdraw, or do not complete course requirements, the scholarship may need to be refunded. This will be at the discretion of Wine Marlborough and NMIT.
4. This scholarship cannot be taken in conjunction with any other NMIT scholarship.
5. The decision about awarding the scholarships will be made by a panel which includes the Wine Marlborough Ltd General Manager, a Wine Marlborough Ltd representative (selected by Wine Marlborough Ltd) and a representative from the NMIT viticulture and wine programme. Decisions of the Panel are final and are not open to appeal.

6. Applications must be forwarded on an official online application form and received by NMIT by 5.00 pm on 31 March. Late applications will not be accepted. The scholarships will be announced early in the academic year and awarded at a function shortly thereafter. You must attend the ceremony or the scholarship may be withdrawn.
7. The award of a scholarship shall become void within two weeks after receiving official advice unless you complete and forward the Acceptance and Agreement Contract to NMIT Scholarship Coordinator that clarifies your acceptance of the scholarship and agreement to perform any obligations, as stated in the Terms of Reference associated with this scholarship.
8. If a debt exists to Studylink or NMIT it will be paid to these accounts. If no debt exists it will be paid into your nominated bank account.
9. The award of the scholarship may be acknowledged in media and marketing material by both NMIT and Wine Marlborough.
10. In accordance with the Privacy Act 1993, you will need to sign a Release Form giving your permission for NMIT and Wine Marlborough to use your personal information for publicity in relation to the scholarship. You can control the content and the length of time it is used.
